#### Secondary Report

In taking some opportunities this week, we re-iterated the need for our students to ensure opportunities that present are taken with both hands.

Matt Ellis from Cricket NSW addressed the secondary school on Monday afternoon around the pathways available to rural and remote students. He indicated that, apart from the pathway Preston is on as an aspiring Aboriginal cricketer, the next step for all of our keen cricketers is the winter program that will run once a month during the off season. This will be an opportunity for skill development but also an opportunity to be seen. We tend to think of elite sportsmen, like those players in the NRL, as the only ones who can make a living from their passion; Matt is a case study of someone who did not reach the elite level as a player but, nonetheless, managed to forge a career in cricket as a development officer. He played Sydney grade cricket, which is the step before Sheffield Shield, but knew in himself that he did not have the talent to reach the elite level in the sport. He adopted a different path and currently works to raise the profile of cricket and standard of junior players in the bush.

On Tuesday, we took the opportunity to hear about my son Mac's life in Dubai as a steward with Emirates, the airline of the United Arab Emirates; he was back in

Australia for a week for a whirlwind tour of western NSW to catch up with friends and family. He wasn't able to come home for 2 years due to Covid, but fortunately for him and our family, he has since been home twice in the last two months, albeit briefly. He talked about life in Dubai, in the sky and the destinations he travelled to. Mac spoke of the cultural differences he experienced and had to adjust to as an Australian living and working in the UAE as well as travelling to countries all over the world. He talked about the joys and challenges of his work. We took the opportunity to learn about another career path that many of the students would not have considered previously and one that can involve living overseas and seeing the world.

On Friday, our secondary students engaged with Jacqui Greenfield's presentation about the risks associated with HPV or the Human Papillomavirus. We learnt about the nature of Jacqui's role as Community Education & Engagement Coordinator at the Australian Cervical Cancer Foundation, the virus itself, its risks, risk mitigation strategies and the implications of all that for teenagers today. All students, male and female, were charged with the responsibility of ensuring that all of the special females in their lives are made aware of the need for regular cervical screening.

Students from years 9-12, along with family and friends, supported Ms Coady at her mother's funeral in Gilgandra on Thursday





morning. As usual, the students represented GCS superbly and with maturity, providing an additional level of support for Ms Coady at a difficult time.

Congratulations to Bailey and Laiken who played off for the 9/10 Health Table Tennis Singles Title last week with Bailey prevailing by a whisker.

We are really lucky to have Mrs Ferguson who has been employed on a part-time basis to assist the delivery of Mathematics to our senior students. Mrs Ferguson brings a wealth of mathematical knowledge to support Mr Ryan with his challenging teaching load and, as the photos attest, to Ella and Tully in particular. We are also lucky to have Mrs Haling who supports Ms Coady in her delivery of Science but also Tully as she juggles Preliminary Biology and Earth and Environmental Science through Distance Education. Our students are very lucky to have the support of these ladies as well as their everyday, dedicated teachers.

We are one week away from the 4-day Sydney/Central Coast excursion. Notes went home last week and are due back at the office by Wednesday at the latest. A groundswell of stakeholder opinion has led to the departure time on Monday morning 28/3/22 being brought forward to 7am. Sorry mums, dads and carers - it's not my fault!! (...blame Ella!!)

Good luck to the secondary girls who are due to play cricket in Dubbo on Tuesday. Other than that, we have an uninterrupted week of toil and slog!




