Secondary Studies Report

Thank you to Mr Martin Paice, the Youth Engagement Officer, for talking to the Secondary School last week. The Commissioner of Police had officially launched a Youth Anti-Violence Education Campaign. This included a commitment to play a 12minute video to every high school student in NSW which was publicly endorsed by the Deputy Premier and Minister for Police, and the Minister for Education and Early Learning. The anti-violence video was produced by the NSW Police Force and co-funded by the Department of Education and the Advocate for Children and Young People. It features high profile players from various sporting codes who share their personal experiences and stance against violence. The video had a strong emphasis on how we can personally respond, how we can control our own reactions to moments to de-escalate that moment. Something that Mr Spora will often emphasis to the students, are you deescalating a situation or making it worse.

Mr Paice also spoke with the students on cyber security, that if you are considering sending any image to someone, that that image will be accessible forever, that once you send an image or message you have no control on how that will be used in the future. The importance of knowing who you are communicating to, have you meet that person face-to-face or are they a friend of a friend? Do you really know who you are talking to online?





too!










